




## Soccer and Football

Soccer is the most popular sport in the world. It's a game people play in the smallest villages and the biggest cities in almost every country. Soccer is played with two teams of 11 people. A team scores a goal when they get the ball into the other team's goal.



The goalkeeper (see picture) is the player who stays by the goal and stops the other team from scoring. Only the goalkeeper can use their hands. All the other players use their feet, heads and chests to move the ball. All goals are worth one point.

Soccer teams from 32 countries around the world play in the World Cup to see who is the best. The World Cup is played once every four years. Over a billion people watched it in 2006.



A auarterback

Football is the most popular sport in the United States. Most high schools and colleges in the US have football teams, and most big cities have professional teams. Football is played with two teams of 11 people. A team scores when they carry the ball into the other team's end zone. This is called a touchdown.

In football, one person on the team is the quarterback (see picture). The quarterback throws the ball to another player on the team. Players try to catch the ball and run to the end zone and get a touchdown. The quarterback can also run with the ball, or hand it to another player.

A touchdown is worth 6 points. After a touchdown, the team can try to kick the ball through the goal posts for one more point. If a team can't get a touchdown, they can try to only kick the ball through the goal posts for 3 points.

The two best professional teams in the US play in the Superbowl. The Superbowl is played the first Sunday in February every year. About 90 million people watched it last year, almost all of them Americans. Football is also played in Canada and Europe, but it's not as popular outside the United States.
